Sunday 14 January – Follow Jesus!

God calls each one of us to follow him. His call may look and sound similar to those of other Christians we know but in truth each call is unique and specific to the individual who is called. Psalm 139 tells us that God sees and knows our inmost being and his call to each one of us takes that into account. We are called to life, but we are also called to purpose.

Reading: John 1: 43-51. The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee. Finding Philip, he said to him, "Follow me." Philip, like Andrew and Peter, was from the town of Bethsaida. Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the

there?" Nathanael asked. "Come and see," said Philip. When Jesus saw Nathanael approaching, he said of him, "Here truly is an Israelite in whom there is no deceit." "How do you know me?" Nathanael asked. Jesus answered, "I saw you while you were still under the fig tree before Philip called you." Then Nathanael declared, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the king of Israel." Jesus said, "You believe because I told you I saw you under the fig tree. You will see greater things than that." He then added, "Very truly I tell you, you will see 'heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending on' the Son of Man." **Thoughts.** Do you remember when you first heard the voice of God calling you to follow him as a disciple? For some this call was coincident to their call to salvation and flowed directly from it. For others who had perhaps grown up with faith always present it is like a gentle awakening to the idea that there was more – a richer deeper journey with God into the depths of faith. The call to Phillip and Nathaniel in this passage differs in process from the call to Andrew and Simon Peter that immediately proceeds our reading. For me who had no real faith to start from salvation came suddenly and it lifted my heavy burden and gave me incredible peace. The call to discipleship would be 6 months later but it would be equally sudden and transformative, and it happened in a stable. The call to discipleship often reveals to the disciple a new revelation as to the depths of Gods intimate knowledge of you, your dreams, aspirations and your past glories and defeats, your brokenness and your competencies and begins to reveal to you his intent in your redemption of calling you to use all of these as resources for his kingdom.
