

Sunday 18 February – Lent 1

Reading: Psalm 51. Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. ² Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. ³ For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. ⁴ Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge. ⁵ Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me. ⁶ Yet you desired faithfulness even in the womb; you taught me wisdom in that secret place. ⁷ Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. ⁸ Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice. Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity. ¹⁰ Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. ¹¹ Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. ¹² Restore to me the joy of your salvation and renew a right spirit within me.

Thoughts. Lent is a season of change. We move into autumn in the natural and spiritually into a time of self-reflection, seeking change, looking for new life and we approach God with expectation. Drawing nearer to God shines a light upon our heart and we are drawn to the psalm – create in me a clean heart - renew us Lord we pray. We want fresh joy, we want to marvel again at your gift of life to us and to be reminded that we are loved beyond price. Wash us whiter than snow.

Prayers: Lord in this Lent take us deep, deeper into you and your mystery of faith. Lead us into uncomfortable places, through the silence to the cross, and on into the light of your risen son. Spirit lead us where our trust is without borders, let us walk upon the waters wherever You would call us. Take us deeper than our feet could ever wander and our faith will be made stronger in the presence of our Saviour.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen

Welcome to session 1 of the Unanswered Prayer study! Over the next five sessions we're going to process some of the painful and disappointing things we've probably all experienced as Christians – which we're not always good at sharing. Remember it is a sign of faith, not doubt, to wrestle with unanswered prayer. We need to talk about unanswered prayer for three reasons:

Emotionally – most of us have pain we need to process.

Intellectually – we may also have questions we need answered.

Culturally – sadly the church can be less honest than the Bible about unanswered prayer.

'Grace grows best in winter' (Samuel Rutherford) - Harsh winters are often the seasons in which we mature and become more fruitful. When have you experienced a 'winter season' in your relationship with God? How did it affect your faith?

"Faith says, 'Even though I don't understand you right now, God, I love you. I believe your heart for me is good.'" (Bob Sorge) What, practically, do you think is needed for persevering in faith and prayer through the 'winter seasons' of life?

A prayer by Ignatius of Loyola: O Christ Jesus, when all is darkness and we feel our weakness and helplessness, give us the sense of Your presence, Your love, and Your strength. Help us to have perfect trust in Your protecting love and strengthening power, so that nothing may frighten or worry us, for, living close to You, we shall see Your hand, Your purpose, Your will through all things. Amen

John 3:16: For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.
